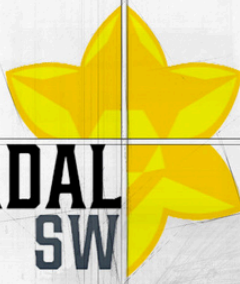

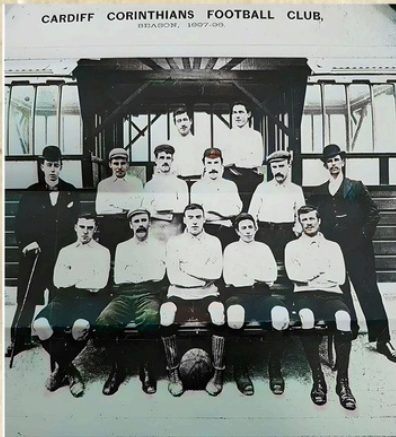

## CARDIFF CORINTHIANS - THE BEGINNING

The early records of Cardiff Corinthians AFC, perhaps better known these days as The Corries, are held at The Glamorgan Archives. The records cover the first 7 years of the clubs long history with the team being formally constituted at a meeting held on 22 July 1898.



The team photo published is what we believe to be the first photograph of a Corinthians team, taken around 1898. The Corinthians did take to the field before July 1898. There are reports of Cardiff Corinthians, a newly formed team playing their initial match at Bonvilston on Boxing Day 1897. A team list was published in the newspaper with instructions for the players to assemble at 13.20 sharp at the Great Western Railway Station in Cardiff.

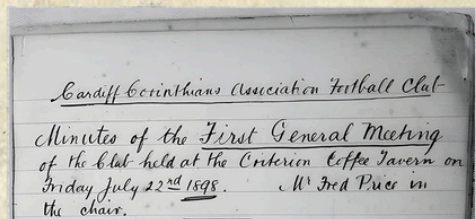
It is well documented that the Corinthians were formed by players from The Cardiff Alpha Cricket team as a means to keep fit and occupied during the winter season. Inspection of the team selected for the 26th December 1897 fixture confirms that it draws

heavily on those who had played for The Alpha Cricket team earlier in the summer.

As to the game itself, Cardiff Corinthians ran out comfortable winners by 10 goals to 1. A very brief report simply confirms that it was a 'very pleasant but by no means a one sided game'.

The scorer for the home side was Parsloe, almost certainly the local Sub postmasters 16 year old son. Although details are not given it would have been surprisn if the names of the local sporting stalwarts

Deere, Holley, Watts and Vaughan did not appear on the Bonvilston match report. So who scored the first goal for The Corries? We will never really be sure but the honour probably went to one of the Price brothers, with Phillip and Roger claiming 7 of the goals scored that day. The Corries in their early days were probably best known for the leadership shown, on and off the field by the Gibson brothers, Jack and Billy. However, in the initial years it was the 5 Price brothers who often provided the backbone of the team, with Fred Price as captain and a towering influence in defence.

So what prompted the the formation of the Corinthians?

The Alpha Cricketers were a tight knit group from the Canton area of Cardiff. Many had first come together as pupils at the Radnor Road Board School and in later years they often returned to play football for the Radnor Road Old Boys team against the masters. Three of their number became teachers, George Gallon, Bill Merrett and Philip Price, with Price teaching at Radnor Road. As a talented sportsman it was no surprise that in the winter months they formed The Cardiff Alpha Football team that played occasional games. Given their connections the opposition was provided, on a number of occasions, by the Cardiff Teachers team.

Even at this early point the Alpha team was clearly of a decent standard. Although the opposition was the reserve team of the Cardiff Teachers, in this period the teachers were a formidable side with their first team playing in the South Wales Association League. There is no definitive record of what prompted the decision to form The Corinthians but the plot may well have been hatched at the Alpha Cricket Club Annual Dinner held at The Philharmonic Restaurant on Wednesday 1st December 1887. As young, mostly single men they were no doubt keen on arranging a Boxing Day fixture, rather than their usual fare of local games at Thompson's Park and Sophia Gardens. Why they chose Bonvilston, other than it was in easy traveling distance from Cardiff by rail, is not clear. As to the team name, they may well have been inspired by the famous Corinthians team formed in London in 1882.

Committed to upholding the principles of sportsmanship and fair play, The Corinthians were seen as a glamorous team who brought together the best amateur players. Declining to enter league or cup competitions, The Corinthians played a series of friendly fixtures and engaged on extensive tours, possibly in their image The Cardiff Corinthians, a similarity styled 'Touring Side' was formed. In the following months The Cardiff Alpha Football team appeared on at least two more occasions in local matches in Cardiff. However, the same group of players also played a further fixture as The Cardiff Corinthians on 29th January 1898 and again at Bonvilston. on that day the backbone of The Alpha Cricket Club, the Gibson, Hill and price families, provided 9 of the players. Was the photograph taken on the 29th January 1898?

Ten of the eleven players who turned out for The Corinthians at Bonvilston are in the photo. The team strip looks very much like the gold and green that The Corinthians used in their first season. However, the records show that 11th man at Bonvilston was ET Williams, while the 11th man in the photo is Bill Wynes. It is, without a doubt a very early photograph of The Corinthians. However, given that the setting cannot be placed and Bill Wynes was not selected for the Bonvilston game, the evidence is far from conclusive that the photograph was taken on 29th January 1898. As the season drew to a close a decision had to be made. Should the Alpha Cricketers also establish a football team on a more formal basis and, if so, how best go about this?

**The aim of the FAW Fair Play Award is to encourage a reduction in on-field misconduct and promote the FAW Fair Play Code.**

### ***Aim***

The FAW, players and their clubs have a duty to raise awareness of the Fair Play message for the good of Welsh football.

The good name of football has survived because the vast majority of people who love the game are honest and fair. Those who defend football's good reputation deserve the recognition of the FAW.

As a result the FAW will honour and publicise these fine examples through the Fair Play Award.

The FAW will reward clubs who are making a significant contribution to improving the behavioural standards in football. Through such collective responsibility the FAW aims to promote team play through Fair Play.

### ***Measurement***

The FAW produces monthly Discipline Tables for the Directly Affiliated Leagues, which details and compares a club's on-field disciplinary record within their league.

The FAW Discipline Tables will form the basis measurement of the FAW Fair Play Award. Clubs who demonstrate fair play on the pitch will have the best chance of winning the award.

As the FAW wants to encourage player, club and fan involvement in order to deliver the FAW Fair Play message, other factors will also be considered before selecting the award winners.

Those clubs who actively take part in delivering the message of Fair Play will also see their efforts count towards being a potential award winner. It will be the duty of the club to evidence such efforts to the FAW.

Examples of player, club and supporter involvement can include displaying the FAW Fair Play message and logo on your website, in your match programmes and drawing attention to it on the day of a game.

Clubs may also wish to take part in schemes such as 'Show Racism the Red Card', who have given their backing to the FAW Fair Play Code. Contact details for Show Racism the Red Card are detailed in this document.

Essentially, Fair Play is something that the players, clubs and fans should "own". It is the responsibility of each to ensure that they spread the message of Fair Play and exemplify their good work to the FAW.



# History Morrison Town AFC

Morrison Town was formed in 1946 initially as Midland Athletic and played briefly in the Swansea and District League prior to joining the Welsh League in 1951 where it stayed until 2008. After suffering successive relegations in the Welsh League and finishing bottom of the Division Three, Town were relegated from the Welsh League after more than 50 years, into the Swansea Senior League. By 2010-11 the Club was languishing in Division Two of the Swansea League, but has been rebuilding over the past few years and with ambitious plans for a better, more successful and sustainable future, firstly in the WWPL and then in the Ardal Southern.

Town were promoted back to Division One of the Swansea League at the end of the 2018-19 season and after a season of consolidation curtailed by COVID19, it then accepted the challenge of playing in the new Macron West Wales Premier League, the commencement of which was delayed until 2021 as a result of COVID-19. This was a big step forward for the Club as the new league has allowed it to refocus further and help it realise its ambitions.

During their time in the Welsh League, Morrison Town eventually progressed through to Division One and during the early 1990s achieved notable success by winning the Division One (Tier 2) Championship in 1990-1991 and were runners up the following season, underlining a very successful period, as these were highlights in its often turbulent history.

Morrison Town's home ground, the Dingle Field, was purchased from a local farmer in the early 1950s. Located in the northern area of Morrison, the Club now have three Senior men's teams, a thriving, popular and successful junior section and the club are already making plans to reform its Youth team (Under 18s) and have formed a new Ladies team.

In 1962 a memorable match at the Dingle attracted a capacity crowd of more than 2,000 to witness former Manchester City, Swansea Town and Wales international, Roy Paul's final game as a player when Morrison Town played Garw Athletic.

As a result of the collective, combined efforts of so many, the Morrison Town is now becoming a popular and important part of the local community, something that was noticeable even in adversity in March 2023, when the Club opened its doors to help all of the local residents who were severely affected by the gas explosion near to the Dingle, many elderly and having to leave their homes. The Club provided warmth and hot drinks, collecting clothing, money, toiletries and food for those affected, with the significant help of businesses including AI Resin, Motorpoint, Dalling Stores, AAH Pharmaceutical, Goose Island and Jack Sullivan's.

The Club is hopeful of a successful future, with records noting that Morrison Town have won nothing for more than 25 years, until success in last season's WWPL Cup Final. That was a long time.

Morrison Town finished last season in 3rd place in the WWPL, and proudly took their place in the Ardal Southern South West Division for the 2023-24 season following obtaining a Tier 3 license and Penlan inability to achieve a licence despite their league success. The players and coaching staff of Johnny Martin, Neil Simon, Jonathan Coates, Andrew Morrow and physio Paul Deakin have all worked hard to achieve this.



# THE START OF CARDIFF CORRIES SUCCESS

Cardiff Corinthians are the most-successful team in the history of the Dragon Signs Amateur Trophy having claimed the cup on six separate occasions, with their first triumph being delivered 110-years ago in April 1914 on the eve of the First World War.

Initially formed in 1897 and officially founded a year later by members of the Alpha Cricket Club as a way for the players to maintain sporting interest during the winter months, at the time the club were regarded as the best amateur team in the country when they prepared to take on Holywell United at Newtown in the final of what was then known as the Welsh Amateur Cup on 11 April 1914. The current Holywell Town, known as Holywell United during that era, may not have been favourites, but they did complete a domestic double having already claimed the North Wales Coast League title and the North Wales Coast Amateur Cup that season. Victories over Colwyn Bay, Bangor Reserves and Johnstown Amateurs had put them within one game of the treble. Cardiff Corinthians had seen off the challenge of Llandrindod Wells, Ynysddu and Llanidloes United to book their place in the final as they went in search of a first-ever trophy. The club had initially

only played friendly fixtures outside of the cricket season in their formative years, but joining the Rhymney Valley League in the early 1900s was a clear statement on the future direction of the club.

Labelled "The game of all games" by the Flintshire Observer two days before, Cardiff Corinthians would claim the trophy with a 1-0 victory. In difficult conditions, the increased height and physicality of the Corries was reported as being the difference on the day, with one league representative from Bangor quoted as saying: "They won the cup by force of weight rather than force of science."

A few days later, the Observer offered a colourful description of events in their match report: "Cardiff Corinthians, playing with the

wind, secured a lead of one goal, and succeeded in maintaining it until the end. Holywell made strenuous efforts to score, striking the crossbar, and missing the desired target by inches. It is not brilliant dove-tailing and pattern weaving methods that count so much in matches of this description, but goals, and the failure to appreciate this truth or the inability to put it into actual practice is the only cause to which Holywell's reverse can be attributed."

Despite the defeat, it was still a season of success for Holywell and their achievements were celebrated on 25 April 1914 when their domestic double was celebrated with the trophy and medal presentations following a 4-1 win over Blaenau Ffestiniog to bring the campaign to a close. However, it almost ended in disaster when the temporary stage erected for the silverware and dignitaries collapsed. Thankfully, nobody was injured and the trophies remained unscathed, so the presentation was allowed to continue.

The outbreak of global conflict just a couple of months later meant that the FAW Amateur Trophy would not be competed for again until 1919/20 when Caerau defeated Barmouth Comrades.

Cardiff Corinthians and Holywell would meet in the final once again in 1961/62, with the Corries

recording their fifth success in the competition with a 3-2 victory having also lifted the trophy in 1929, 1930 and 1934. Their sixth and latest success would arrive in 1984/85 when Brecon Corries were defeated 2-1 in a replay following a 2-2 draw.

Holywell would again also reach the final in 1926 and 1927, but would not claim the trophy until 2011 when they defeated Conwy United 3-2, and they repeated their long-awaited achievement in 2015 when Penrhyndeudraeth were beaten 4-2. Their most-recent success coming just over a century since they reached the final for the very first time. But while Cardiff Corinthians would appear to have briefly enjoyed their triumph as the best amateur team in the country prior to the outbreak of the First World War, their success came at a price.

On 29 May 1914, the North Wales Chronicle reported on the minutes of a recent FAW Council meeting – "Cardiff Corinthians F.C. reported a considerable loss on the Welsh Amateur Final, in which they took part, and on the suggestion of Mr Stephens (Council member) it was decided to make a grant to the club equivalent to the amount of the players' railway fares."

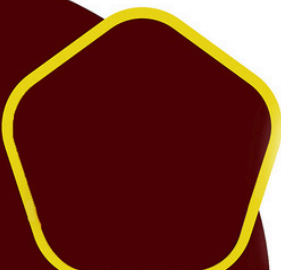

## THE INCREDIBLE STORY OF HOW BARCELONA'S JOURNEY TO BECOME KINGS OF EUROPE STARTED AGAINST A LITTLE WELSH CLUB

The untold tale of Cardiff Corinthians AFC became the first British side to take on the Nou Camp giants and helped set them on the road to success. Deep in their history is a link with a little Welsh league club that played a significant part in Barcelona's rise to success. Here is the lost story of Barcelona & Cardiff Corinthians.

### AN UNLIKELY FOOTBALL TALE....

More than a century ago, crowds were gathering in huge numbers to watch the champions of Spain take on opponents from a foreign land in a bid to put their domestic dominance to the test. Only, unlike the moment when Barcelona take on other European giants in the UEFA Champions league, the club who challenged Barcelona's supremacy on the evening of June 5 1910 were not a European superpower whose name is still recognised throughout the continent. They were The Cardiff Corinthians AFC - and they were the first British club to play the rising force from Catalonia that Barcelona had become.



You could assume such a claim to fame would be something Cardiff Corinthians - or simply The Corries - would cling to and boast about as they play out their fixtures in The Ardal Southern league. It is a world away from the Champions league & El Clasico matches

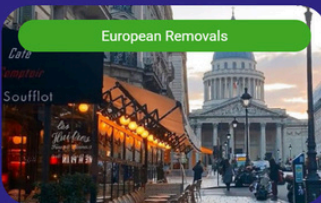
